- The sensory development of the infant, toddler, and young child and the support for its healthy unfolding.
- Creating and supporting play as a primary learning experience for infants, toddlers, and nursery ages.
- Working with parents.
- Creating programs for infants, toddlers, nursery groups, and parent and child programs.
- Embryology
- Studies in anthroposophy, Rudolf Steiner's philosophy, as a support for the inner development of ourselves as teachers and understanding the relationship between the human being and the world.
